About the play

The genesis of Pentimento came from my mum who died two years at the age of 89. She suffered from dementia at the end and had no short term memory, but memories from her childhood in Ireland and young life as a nurse in London during the war were still vibrant. She left Ireland as a girl of 17 and had never returned until a few years ago when we took her to a family celebration. This trip provoked host of new memories for her and after she died I was drawn to make a piece of theatre about her.

In January of last year I traveled to Clonmel where she was born, to research our family history and to explore the landscape in which she grew up. After this I started to work with Clemence and the piece became much more personal. I began discovering what it felt like for my mother, a fiercely independent and driven woman, to be reduced to having to depend on others for everything from eating to dressing to the most personal care. How it felt to have a memory slip out of your grasp, a face you loved dearly become a stranger, and most of all, to no longer be able to dance. We found a parallel story was emerging, that of letting go, both for her and for me. When can we recognise that moment has come? People say it is often when our loved ones are far away as I was when she died. Then we understood that making the show was my way of letting go of her.

Clemence is a writer, director, actor and drama facilitator. What interests and excites her is to create the theatre of today. Passionate about social and environmental issues, Clemence trained in physical theatre in Jacques Lecoq in Paris. Founder and artistic director of Theatre Libellule, she created her solo show 'How to Become a Woman?' last year, as well as the Forum theatre show 'Hystoria' with the Kali Collective, both exploring women's identity and status in today's society. She runs the Blue Elephant Theatre youth theatre in London as well as the Forum Theatre mental health project B scene. Recent directing includes 'The Empty Frame' at Theatre 503 in January 2015, a show about fertility issues written by a fertility psychologist. She is also a facilitator at Cardboard Citizens, whose members have experienced homelessness and/or prison.
